Bridging the Information Gap Between Health and the Environment in North Carolina

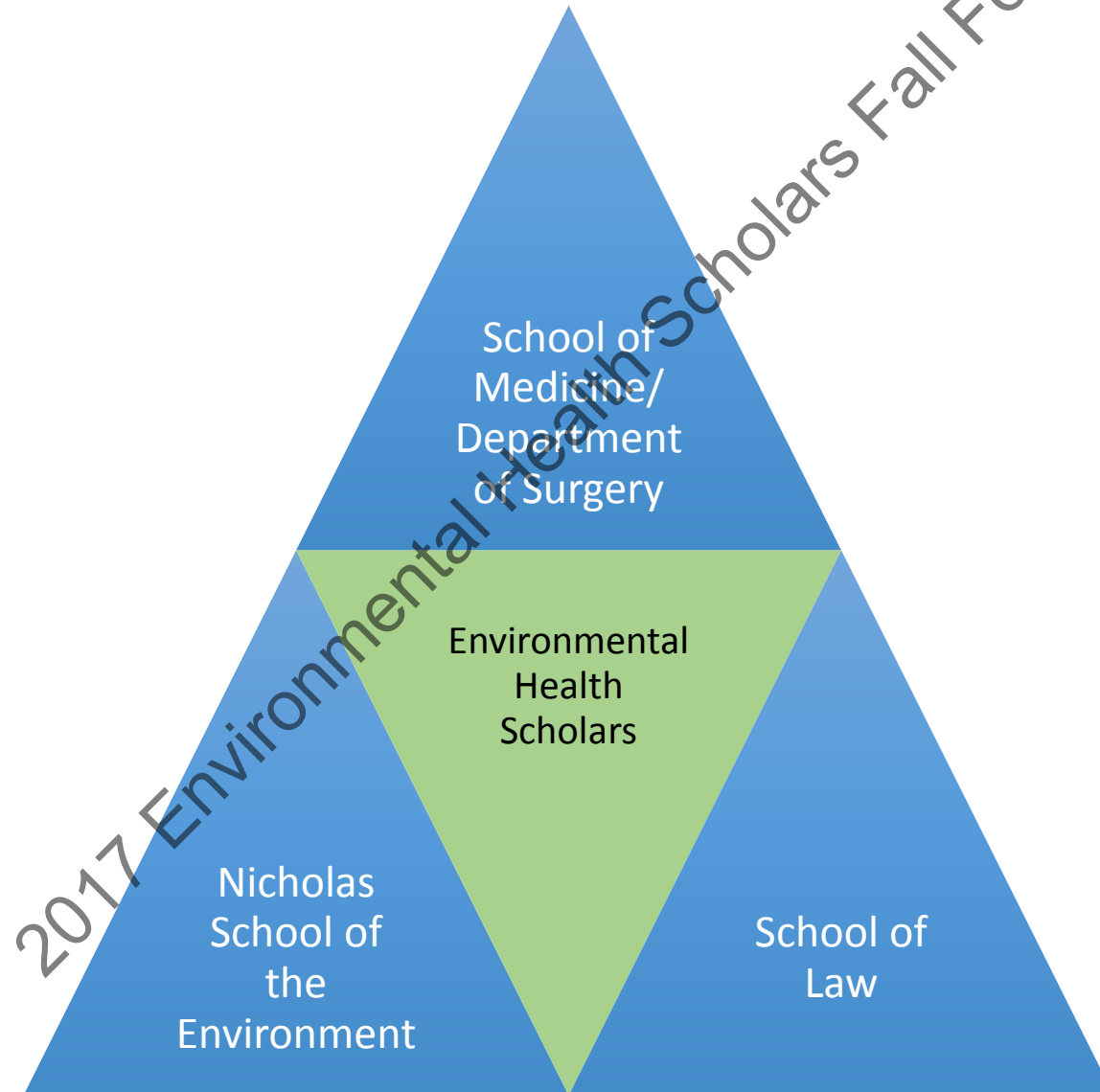

- Special emphasis is encouraged on initiatives that examine the economic and policy issues that shape outcomes in disease prevention and can associate environmental factors and health probabilities.

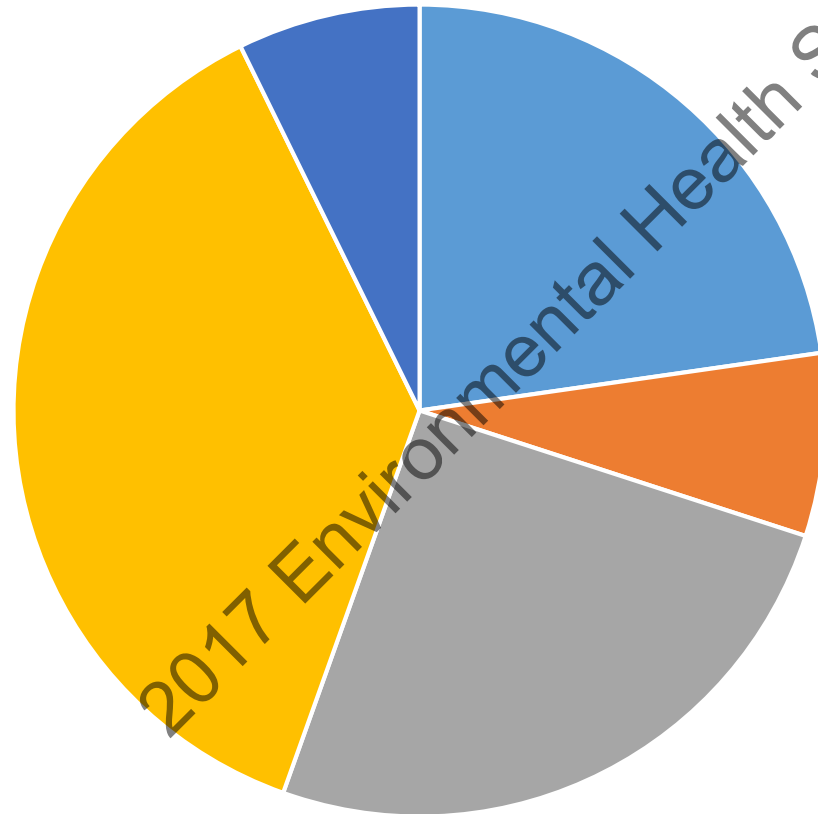
