William H. Schlesinger



- William H. Schlesinger is the former President of the Cary Institute of Ecosystem Studies, after 27 years on the faculty of Duke University. Completing his A.B. at Dartmouth (1972), and Ph.D. at Cornell (1976), he moved to Duke in 1980, where he retired in spring 2007 as Dean of the Nicholas School of the Environment and Earth Sciences and as James B. Duke Professor of Biogeochemistry.

- Ken Cook, president and co-founder of Environmental Working Group, is widely recognized as one of the environmental community's most prominent and effective critics of U.S. farm and food policy and a leading voice on federal chemicals and pesticides law.

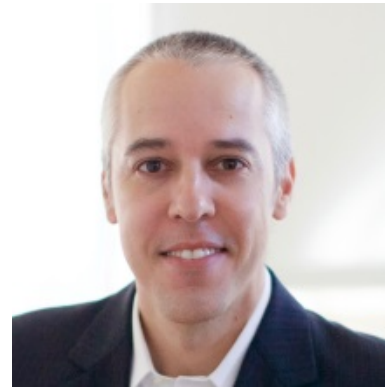
